Article X, Section 2 thereof provides "[t]he territorial and political subdivisions 25 shall enjoy local autonomy. Furthermore, Section 1 of the same article also edicts 26 27 that [t]here shall be autonomous regions in Muslim Mindanao and the Cordilleras as hereinafter provided. 28 29 The historic signing of the Comprehensive Agreement on the Bangsamoro 30 (CAB) between the government of the Philippines (GPH) and the Moro Islamic 31 Liberation Front (MILF), and the enactment of Republic Act 11054, also known 32 as the Bangsamoro Organic Law (BOL), paved the way for the replacement of the 33 Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao with the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao. This law is also expected to empower the 34 35 Bangsamoro community to address and end poverty, establish lasting peace, 36 avert violence and extremism and achieve genuine development and prosperity in 37 their region. 38 In order to attain this, harmonized regional development is a very important target in economic policy-making. It is important to promote a good 39

In order to attain this, harmonized regional development is a very important target in economic policy-making. It is important to promote a good balance between regions to secure political and economic stability and to stimulate the active participation of the people. But harmonized economic growth necessitates focused planning and policy-making which decentralized agency must promote in close coordination with national long-term development plans. The defunct Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (ARMM) has its Regional

Economic and Development Planning Board (REDPB) which is the highest planning and policy-making body. During the transition phase of the Bangsamoro Government, it is very important to put in place a structure like the REDPB that will provide direction to its overall development in the region. Section 4, Article XIII of the BOL provides for the establishment of the Bangsamoro Economic and Development Council (hereinafter "Council") which shall serve as the planning, monitoring, and coordinating agency for all development plans, programs, and projects of the Bangsamoro Government.

 With this bill, we aim to create a **Bangsamoro Economic and Development Council (BEDC)** that will serve as a primary institution that sets and guides the direction of comprehensive socio-economic development effort and other development concerns and priorities in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region. To ensure people's participation, the Council shall take into account the development plans of the provinces, cities, municipalities, and barangays as approved by their respective local development councils.

In view of the foregoing, I seek the expeditious consideration and approval of this measure in the Parliament.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE BANGSAMORO ECONOMIC AND DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL, DEFINING ITS POWERS AND FUNCTIONS, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Parliament of the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao assembled:

Name – This Act shall be known as the "Bangsamoro Economic and Development Council Act of 2019."

SECTION 2. Declaration of Policies – It is the declared policy of the Bangsamoro Government to pursue the acceleration of social, economic, and political development and promote the welfare of its constituents through a effective and responsive planning, coordination, and monitoring and evaluation of the implementation of plans, policies programs and projects in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM).

Towards this end, the Bangsamoro Government shall ensure that socioeconomic development programs and activities in the region are well coordinated and responsive to the needs of its constituents and consistently aligned with national development plans such as the Philippine Development Plan. It shall encourage the active participation of various government agencies, Local Government Units (LGUs), Non-Government Organizations (NGOs) as well as private sector at the regional and local levels in the formulation of development plans and other planning and development activities in the BARMM.

SECTION 3. Creation of the Bangsamoro Economic and Development Council - There shall be created a Bangsamoro Economic and Development Council (BEDC) which shall serve as the highest governing and development policy-making body of the Bangsamoro socio-economic Government. It shall serve as the planning, coordinating, and monitoring agency for all development plans, policies, programs and projects of the Bangsamoro Government including its constituent LGUs.

SECTION 4. Composition – The BEDC shall be composed of the following regular members:

a. Chairman: Chief Minister

b. Vice-Chairman: BPDA Director General Members:

 d. Majority Floor Leader of the Bangsamoro Parliament
 e. Minority Floor Leader of the Bangsamoro Parliament

e. Minority Floor Leader of the Bangsamoro Parliament f. Chairman of Planning Committees

g. All Provincial Governors

h. All City Mayors

i. Five Private Sector Representatives

For the effective performance of the Council's functions, the composition of the BEDC can be reconstituted by the Chief Minister upon recommendation of the majority of the members of the Council.

It shall select the private sector representatives to the Council, subject to the guidelines and qualification criteria to be formulated by the BPDA and approved by the Council.

 Additional members from other sectors may be considered upon recommendation and approval of the BEDC. Voting and non-voting ex officio members shall be determined in the internal rules and regulations to be formulated by the BEDC.

SECTION 5. BEDC Chairman – The Chief Minister shall act as the Chairman of the BEDC, preside over its meetings and performs such other duties and functions as may be necessary in the conduct of the affairs of the Council.

SECTION 6. BEDC Vice Chairman — The Director General of the Bangsamoro Planning and Development Authority (BPDA), in addition to its functions as such, shall serve as the Vice Chairman of the BEDC. The Vice-Chair shall preside the BEDC meeting in the absence of the Chairman and perform such other duties as may be assigned by the Council.

SECTION 7. **Functions of the BEDC** – The BEDC shall have the following functions and responsibilities:

- Direct the plan formulation and recommend for approval by the Parliament the short, medium and long-term development plans of the BARMM;
- 2. Review, prioritize, and endorse the annual and multi-year investment program of BARMM to the Parliament for approval, and possible funding by the national government and other partners;
- 3. Ensure that the approved development plans of provinces, cities municipalities and barangays are taken into consideration in the Bangsamoro regional development plan;

4. Promote and direct the inflow and allocation of private investments in the region to support regional development goals, policies and strategies;

- 5. Coordinate the development, funding and implementation of programs and projects of various ministries or LGUs in the BARMM to insure their effectiveness and responsiveness to the needs of the Bangsamoro;
- Monitor and evaluate all development programs and projects implemented by the national government, Bangsamoro ministries/line agencies/offices, local government units, and government owned and/or controlled corporations in the BARMM;
- 7. Call upon any representative of the concerned national agencies, ministries/line agencies/offices, LGUs, and government owned and/or controlled corporations on issues and concerns affecting the implementation of their programs and projects in the BARMM; and

SECTION 8. Meeting of the BEDC – The BEDC shall meet regularly once every quarter at such time, place and date as may be determined and fixed by the BEDC. The Chairman or the majority of its member may call a special meeting for a specific purpose with a compelling reason at least five (5) days before the special meeting. A majority of the member of the Council shall constitute a quorum to do business. In no case a proxy shall be allowed in any meeting of the Council be it regular or special meeting.

SECTION 9. BEDC Technical Secretariat – The BPDA shall serve as the Technical Secretariat of the BEDC. The BEDC Technical Secretariat shall be headed by the BPDA Director General to ensure the technical capability and competence of the Council.

SECTION 10. Functions of the Technical Secretariat – The BPDA as the Technical Secretariat of the Council and shall perform the following functions:

1. Facilitate and coordinate the formulation and implementation of development plan and investment program of the BARMM;

2. Provide technical and administrative support to the Council and its committees;

3. Upon request, provide technical assistance on planning to BARMM ministries, line agencies, LGUs, NGOs, and other government agencies in the BARMM;
4. Develop and maintain a comprehensive management information

system;
5. Develop a comprehensive program for capability building for the members of the Council in areas of regional and local planning, project development, investment programming, monitoring and evaluation

and other necessary concerns crucial to the functions of the Council;

6. Perform such other functions as may be assigned by the Council.

SECTION 11. Executive Committee – The BEDC shall create an Executive Committee to act on matters that require immediate attention for and on behalf of the BEDC, when it is not in session. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the following:

- a) Chief Minister, Chairman
- b) BPDA Director General, Vice Chairmanc) Executive Secretary, Member

- d) Minister of Finance, Budget and Management, Member
- e) All Sectoral Committee Chairpersons, Member

 Subject to the internal rules and regulations of the BEDC, the Executive Committee shall be responsible in overseeing the execution of the economic and development plans as may be directed by the BEDC.

 Other members of the Executive Committee may be determined by the internal rules and regulations with the appropriate proportion of voting and ex-officio non-voting members.

SECTION 12. Meeting of the Executive Committee – The Executive Committee (Exe Com) shall meet quarterly at such time, place and date as may be

determined and fixed by the ExeCom. The meeting shall be set before the meeting of the BEDC.
