RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE OFFICE OF THE CHIEF MINISTER TO INCLUDE THE DETAILED SEPARATION PLAN FOR THE ARMM EMPLOYEES DURING THE CHIEF MINISTERS HOUR

WHEREAS, Article XVI of Republic Act No. 11054, otherwise known as the Organic Law for the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao, mandates the Bangsamoro Transition Authority (BTA) to prioritize the organization of the bureaucracy of the Bangsamoro Government during transition, including the approval and implementation of a transition plan, and the institution of a placement process for the hiring of personnel during the transition period;

WHEREAS, priorities during transition include the disposition of the ARMM employees and personnel as one of the mandates of the Bangsamoro Transition Authority;

WHEREAS, on June 17, 2019, the BTA approved the Transition Plan, subject to further improvements, which includes the timeline for the gradual phasing-out of offices under the ARMM. Under said timeline, the implementation of the phasing out begins on September 2019;

WHEREAS, more than 6,000 employees stand to be relieved from their positions (in the regional bureaucracy) by the end of the year. Notwithstanding the general orientation on the phase out process undergone by the affected personnel, a number of employees are still confused on the status of their separation from service;

WHEREAS, Minister Naguib Sinarimbo of the BARMM Ministry of Interior and Local Government, the concurrent regional spokesperson, in a news report, said that the last part of the phase-out process is due in December this year, and has further stated that the new ministries are tasked to submit a final computation of separation incentives of all affected employees to the BARMM Office of the Executive Secretary;

WHEREAS, in order to properly respond to the queries of the concerned employees, it is necessary for the BTA to keep abreast of the status of the implementation of the gradual phasing-out of offices specifically the details on the separation plan for said employees;

WHEREAS, the rights and privileges of the affected employees envisioned in the Transition Plan serves as one of the BTA's top-priorities, hence they shall be entitled to the applicable retirement, or separation benefits as provided in the Organic Law.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sec. 4, Rule XIX of the Parliamentary Rules, Procedures, and Practices of the BTA, the Chief Minister shall report to the Bangsamoro Parliament on the accomplishments and status of the Interim Cabinet or the Government of the Day once a month;

WHEREAS, it is necessary to include the detailed separation plan for the ARMM employees in the next immediate Chief Minister's Report in order to apprise the affected employees envisioned in the transition plan of their rights and privileges during the phase-out period;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Parliament, to request the Office of the Chief Minister include in his report to the the members of the Bangsamoro Transition Authority the detailed separation plan for the employees affected by the gradual phasing out of offices in the new regional government.
