**RESOLUTION NO. 257**

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**A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE MINISTRY OF BASIC, HIGHER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION (MBHTE) TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR SALARIES OF TEACHERS AIDS**

**WHEREAS, Sec. 14 of Art. IX of RA 11054** provides *Rights of the Children*. – The Bangsamoro Government shall respect, and promote the rights of children, especially orphans of tender age. They shall be protected from exploitation, abuse, and discrimination. Their education and development, both physical and mental, shall be fully addressed.

Bangsamoro policies and programs shall take into utmost consideration the best interest of children, and promote and protect the rights of the children, youth, and adolescents, including their survival and development.


The Bangsamoro Government and its constituent local government units shall provide for adequate funding and effective mechanisms for implementation of this policy;

**WHEREAS, 1st. Par. of Sec. 16, Art. IX of of RA 11054** provide *Integrated System of Quality Education*. – It shall be a top priority of the Bangsamoro Government to establish, maintain, and support a complete and integrated system of quality education, which shall be a subsystem of the national quality education system. The Bangsamoro Government shall develop an educational framework relevant to the needs, ideals, and aspirations of the Bangsamoro people. For this purpose, the Bansamoro Government shall conform to the minimum standards set by the National Government.

**WHEREAS,** to supplement the unavailability of able and willing regular public primary and elementary teachers to far flung area within the BARMM, teacher aids were employed by the MBHTE but being paid by

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the municipal or barangay governments to act as public school teachers of primary or elementary schools;


**WHEREAS**, records shows that these far flung assigned teacher aids receives a very meager monthly honoraria for services rendered. In the Municipality of Upi, 65 of teacher aids are receiving Five Thousand Pesos (P 5, 000) and in the Municipality of South Upi, 120 they are only receiving One Thousand Pesos (P1,000.00) monthly honoraria. Seven Hundred Fifty Pesos (P 750.00) of latter is from the Municipality and Two Hundred Fifty (P 250.00) thereof is from the parents of the enrollies;

**WHEREAS**, these teacher aids impart learning to multi-grade pupils or students and are in charge with the over-all operations of their respective rooms or school;

**WHEREAS**, without doubts, these monthly honoraria would hardly support the monthly basic needs of the employed teacher aids, hence, a lot of them resigned or just quit from reporting to the detriment or disadvantage of the pupils and students;

**NOW THEREFORE**, be it **RESOLVED** as it is **HEREBY RESOLVED** to request the Ministry of Basic, Higher and Technical Education to appropriate funds to augment the municipal employed teacher aid honoraria from its regular funds or other legal sources.
