A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE SINCERE APPRECIATION AND GRATITUDE OF THE BANGSAMORO TO THE NATIONAL GOVERNMENT, MOST ESPECIALLY TO PRESIDENT FERDINAND R. MARCOS JR. FOR HIS LEADERSHIP IN PROVIDING TIMELY AND GENEROUS ASSISTANCE TO THE PEOPLE OF THE BANGSAMORO WHO SUFFERED CATASTROPHIC DAMAGE CAUSED BY SEVERE TROPICAL STORM PAENG

WHEREAS, on 26 October 2022, Severe Tropical Storm Paeng (international name: Nalgae) made landfall in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM) causing massive destruction, loss of lives, and damage to agriculture and critical infrastructures brought about by flooding, sea surge and landslides.

WHEREAS, based on the data released by the Bangsamoro Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (BDRRMC), at least 570,285 individuals were affected by Severe Tropical Storm Paeng including 53 casualties, 12 missing, and 38 injured across the region.

WHEREAS, a total of 371 houses were damaged, while 480 were partially damaged. Damages to infrastructure and agriculture within the region, caused

55 by the onslaught of Severe Tropical Storm Paeng is estimated to be around Php
56 585, 602,426.33;

58 **WHEREAS**, on 29 October 2022, Bangsamoro Chief Minister Ahod Ebrahim
59 declared a state of calamity in the Bangsamoro Region.

61 **WHEREAS**, due to the complete devastation caused by Severe Tropical Storm
62 Paeng, thousands are without access to basic supplies, including food, clean
63 drinking water, and medical equipment, necessitating urgent assistance and
64 response efforts, including procuring, transporting, and distributing emergency
65 relief commodities for the affected population;

67 **WHEREAS**, on 1 November 2022 President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. together
68 with Department of National Defense Senior Undersecretary Jose Faustino Jr.,
69 Special Assistant to the President Sec. Antonio Lagdameo Jr., Department of
70 Social Welfare and Development Office Sec. Erwin Tulfo, Department of Interior
71 and Local Government Sec. Benjamin Abalos Jr. and Senator Robin Padilla,
72 personally came to the Bangsamoro to oversee and provide much-needed
73 collaborative action for disaster relief and disaster management to alleviate the
74 suffering of the typhoon victims;

76 **WHEREAS**, this proactive initiative and compassion of President Ferdinand
77 Marcos Jr. to the People of the Bangsamoro was instrumental in ensuring that
78 basic goods and relief reached the calamity-stricken areas;


