A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE SINCERE APPRECIATION AND GRATITUDE OF THE BANGSAMORO TO SENATOR RAMON "BONG" REVILLA JR. FOR PROVIDING DISASTER RELIEF AND ASSISTANCE TO THE PEOPLE OF THE BANGSAMORO WHO SUFFERED CATASTROPHIC DAMAGE CAUSED BY SEVERE TROPICAL STORM PAENG

WHEREAS, on October 26, 2022, a severe tropical storm known as Paeng (international name: Nalgae) hit the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM), resulting in significant destruction, loss of life, and damage to agriculture and critical infrastructure due to flooding, sea surge, and landslides.

WHEREAS, according to the Bangsamoro Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (BDRRMC), Severe Tropical Storm Paeng affected at least 570,285 individuals in the region, with 53 fatalities, 12 missing persons, and 38 injured persons.

WHEREAS, Severe Tropical Storm Paeng damaged 371 houses and partially damaged 480 others in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM). The storm also caused significant damage to infrastructure and agriculture, with estimated losses of around PHP 585,602,426.33;

WHEREAS, on 29 October 2022, Bangsamoro Chief Minister Ahod Ebrahim declared a state of calamity in the Bangsamoro Region due to the widespread damage and destruction brought about by Severe Tropical Storm Paeng;

WHEREAS, due to the complete devastation caused by Severe Tropical Storm Paeng, many people were left without access to basic supplies, including food, clean drinking water, and medical equipment. This necessitated urgent assistance and response efforts, including the procurement, transportation, and distribution of emergency relief commodities for the affected population.;

WHEREAS, Senator Ramon "Bong" Revilla Jr. visited the Bangsamoro Region, particularly in Datu Odin, Sinsuat, Maguindanao, and distributed food packs and other relief goods, as part of a disaster relief initiative, to the communities affected by Severe Tropical Storm Paeng;

WHEREAS, to alleviate the suffering of the people of the Bangsamoro, the Senator expressed his support and solidarity with the calamity-stricken families.

WHEREAS, Senator Ramon "Bong" Revilla Jr. played a significant role in making sure that basic goods and relief supplies reached the people of the Bangsamoro region who were affected by the disaster; his proactive approach and compassion were instrumental in providing much-needed assistance to those in need;

NOW THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved by the Bangsamoro Transition Authority, the Bangsamoro extends its heartfelt gratitude and appreciation to Senator Ramon "Bong" Revilla Jr. for his quick response and assistance in the disaster relief efforts.
