13 **APPRECIATION AND GRATITUDE OF THE BANGSAMORO**
14 **GOVERNMENT TO THE PRIVATE SECTORS – CIVIC, RELIGIOUS,**
15 **ACADEME, BUSINESS, YOUTH, WOMEN, AND THE MEDIA - RADIO,**
16 **TELEVISION, AND SOCIAL MEDIA, AND TO THE CONCERNED CITIZENS**
17 **FOR PROVIDING TIMELY DISASTER RELIEF AND HUMANITARIAN**
18 **ASSISTANCE TO THE PEOPLE OF BANGSAMORO WHO SUFFERED**
19 **CATASTROPHIC DAMAGE CAUSED BY SEVERE TROPICAL STORM**
20 **PAENG**

22 **WHEREAS**, on October 31, 2022 Severe Tropical Storm Paeng has left
23 the region with most of the fatalities came from Mindanao, where they were
24 victims of either landslides or flooding.¹

25
26 **WHEREAS**, report shows that in BARMM alone, a total number of
27 populations affected by the tropical storm reached 568,969 or roughly half
28 million of the population of the region or 217,719 families.²

29
30 **WHEREAS**, *Private Sectors*, may or may not be in partnership with the
31 Local Government Units (LGUs), are among the first responders in providing
32 relief and humanitarian assistance in the occurrence of natural and man-
33 made catastrophes.

34 **WHEREAS**, the religious sectors through *Archdiocesan Social Action*
35 *Group, Christian for Peace Movement, Oblates of Mary Immaculate (OMI), and*
36 *Oblates of Notre Dame (OND)*, to name a few, in partnership with the Office of
37 the Settler Communities, City Mayor, Barangay Officials and in coordination
38 with Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction Management Office (MDRRMO), with
39 the support and assistance of the Philippine Coast Guard and Philippine Army
40 conducted relief operation by providing food packs of assorted rice, cup
41 noodles, and sardines, and water containers in the remote area of North Upi
42 Maguindanao, (Barangay Sitio Magutay and Barangay Kabakaba), Timanan
43 South Upi Maguindanao (Barangay Kuya), and relief goods distributed to GKK
44 families (Gagmayng Kristohanong Katilingban a Cebuano words of Basic
45 Ecclesial Community) affected by Bagyong Paeng at Sto. Niño Chapel,
46 Barangay Limo, Sultan Kudarat, Maguindanao.

47
48 **WHEREAS**, the *Cotabato Light and Power Company* in coordination
49 with the MDDRMO, responded quickly to deliver relief goods to areas affected
50 by Tropical Storm Paeng. A hundred thirty (130) sacks of rice, 88 boxes of
51 canned goods, and 42 boxes of noodles were turned over to Cotabato City and
52 Sultan Kudarat LGUs on October 31, and to Datu Odin Sinsuat LGU on
53 November 1.³

54
55 **WHEREAS**, the Philippine Red Cross (PRC) sent sleeping and hygiene
56 kits to 425 individuals in Barangay Awang, Datu Odin Sinsuat in
57 Maguindanao. The kits include two plastic mats, mosquito nets, and
58 blankets, body soaps, laundry soaps and other toiletries. It also served hot
59 meals to 803 individuals in Barangay Dinaig and donated 10,000 liters of
60 water in Barangay Bagumbayan. The organization deployed staff, volunteers
61 and relief operation equipment to areas affected by Paeng.⁴

62
63 **WHEREAS**, Lifeline services (power, water, telecommunications)
64 destroyed and affected by Paeng were restored with the support and
65 assistance of the private sectors. Individuals from medical association,
66 members of Multi Sectoral Advisory Board and other private sectors such as
67 but not limited to civic organization, business sector, youth, women, media,
68 and other concerned citizens had also rendered temporary shelter, relief
69 rehabilitation, and other disaster-related services to evacuees and victims of
70 typhoon Paeng.
