### AN ACT

GRANTING CASH INCENTIVES AND RECOGNITION TO BANGSAMORO TOPNOTCHERS, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER **PURPOSES** 

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

Section 2 (3), Article XIV of the 1987 Constitution mandates the establishment and maintenance of an incentive system, among others, which shall be available to deserving students in both public and private schools, especially to the underprivileged.

The Bangsamoro Government has consistently honored the achievements of its exceptional constituents in their respective fields of work and professions. And the Bangsamoro Topnotcher Act of 2023 is one way of expressing gratitude for the honor and pride that the Bangsamoro topnotchers bring to the Bangsamoro through their remarkable performance in their academic pursuits.

The Bangsamoro Parliament approved and adopted Proposed Resolution Nos. 260, 261, 203, 218, 234, 257, 295, and 309 commending and congratulating Nishrien Amatonding Barua, Al-Zaheer Adil Abubakar, Hamid Simpal Salik, Benjamin Rinabor, Piamae Keil Roslin, Nur-Hafieza Jannah I. Abinal, Yasser Binsuan, and Abdul Baterbonia Lumanggal, respectively for being topnotchers in the national licensure examinations. They have followed in the footsteps of Atty. Macapanton Abbas Sr., Atty. Kamar M. Boloto, Atty. Gafar E. Lutian, Atty. Mylene Amerol-Macumbal, and Atty. Princess Fatima Parahiman landed Top 2 in the Philippine bar exam.

Rewarding systems have often been used to help improve students' academic achievements. The desire for the reward develops a healthy learning habit and generates interest, which leads to effort and results.

In accordance with the above-mentioned mandate, a *Bangsamoro Topnotcher Act of* 2023 will be institutionalized in order to recognize the competence and brilliance of the Bangsamoro and to ensure the continuation of a legacy in the academe.

This will also serve as an inspiration to the graduates to strive for excellence in their respective fields and endeavors. The recognition to be accorded to these topnotchers deserves emulation and, therefore, is worthy of public acknowledgment.

In light of the vital significance of education in nation-building, the approval of this bill is earnestly sought.

31 32 33 34	<b>SECTION 1.</b> <i>Short Title.</i> <b>-</b> This Act shall be known as the " <i>Bangsamoro Topnotcher Act of 2023</i> ".		
35 36 37 38 39 40 41	<b>SECTION 2.</b> <i>Declaration of Policy.</i> – It is hereby declared the policy of the Bangsamoro Government to promote excellence in academic pursuits by providing incentives to Bangsamoro individuals who have brought honor and recognition to the region by topping national licensure examinations. Towards this end, it shall establish and maintain an incentive system which shall be available to deserving students in both public and private schools.		
42 43 44	<b>SECTION 3.</b> <i>Definition of Terms.</i> – As used in this Act, the term "Bangsamoro Topnotcher/s" refers to Bangsamoro individuals who earned a spot in the Top ten (10) lists of their respective professional licensure examinations given by the Professional		

Regulatory Commission (PRC) or the Supreme Court of the Philippines: *Provided,* That he or she must be a resident and a registered voter in the Bangsamoro region prior to the examination.

**SECTION 4.** *Cash Incentives for Bangsamoro Topnotcher.* – *Bangsamoro Topnotchers* shall be entitled to cash awards in the following amounts:

1. Top One (1) to Three (3) - One Hundred Thousand Pesos (P100,000.00) each;

2. Top Four (4) to Six (6) - Seventy-Five Thousand Pesos (P75,000.00) each; and

3. Top Seven (7) to Ten (10) - Fifty Thousand Pesos (50,000.00) each.

*Provided,* That these amounts may be increased whenever circumstances so warrant, and the recipient shall be invited to regional events that recognize and acknowledge the importance of excellence in academic pursuits.

**SECTION 5.** *Prohibition Against Diminution of Incentives* – No memorandum, order, or issuance shall diminish the prescribed schedule of incentives. Donations and gifts from individuals, institutions, or groups shall be construed as distinct and separate from the cash incentives provided herein.

**SECTION 6.** *Implementing Agency.* – Within ninety (90) days from the approval of this Act, the Ministry of Basic, Higher, and Technical Education shall develop and adopt a program to effectuate the provisions of this Act and promulgate such rules and regulations that will govern the grant of awards and incentives.

**SECTION 7.** *Appropriations.* – The amount necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act shall be included in the budget of the Ministry of Basic, Higher, and Technical Education. Thereafter, such sums as may be necessary for the continued implementation of this Act shall be included in the annual Bangsamoro Appropriations Act.

**SECTION 8.** *Repealing Clause.* – All regional laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations, other issuances, or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

**SECTION 9.** *Separability Clause.* - If any provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, all other parts or provisions not affected thereby shall continue to remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION 10.** *Effectivity.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen days (15) after its complete publication in at least two (2) regional newspapers of general circulation.
