AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE LOCAL AREA NETWORK (LAN) SYSTEM OF THE BANGSAMORO GOVERNMENT

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The internet has now become indispensable to almost every transaction especially in the aspect of delivering public services. However, the convenience brought by technology is not without burden. To preserve the convenience of technology especially internet, substantial amount of funds is needed for its long-term sustainability. Second, government data stored in the internet are prone to hacking compared to those locally stored in computers not shared in the internet. Third, Local Area Network system does not require internet connection. Therefore, even in cases if calamity where internet is unserviceable, government services can still continue if LAN is established in the Bangsamoro Government. And these are just some of the examples why we need to establish LAN in our government. It will save us more funds.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE LOCAL AREA NETWORK (LAN) SYSTEM OF THE BANGSAMORO GOVERNMENT

Be it enacted by the Bangsamoro Transition Authority Parliament of the BARMM:

SECTION 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Bangsamoro LAN Act."

SECTION 2. *Policy*. – It is the policy of the Bangsamoro Government to support the development of appropriate and self-reliant scientific and technological capabilities, enhance economic prosperity and preserve the comfort and convenience of its inhabitants. It is also the policy of the Bangsamoro Government to deliver services to the inhabitants of the region in speedy, efficient, and effective manner.

SECTION 3. General Objectives. - This Act seeks to:

- Establish in the Bangsamoro Government a fast, reliable, and economical Local Area Network (LAN) system for efficient and effective delivery of services to the inhabitants of the region;
- b. Ensure the security of data of the Bangsamoro Government;

SECTION 4. Definition of Terms. – When used in this Act, the following term shall have the following meaning assigned to them:

- (a) "LAN is a computer network established within a small geographic area, such as a house, office or buildings and allow resource sharing, including printers, apps and other shared services; allow multiple devices on a LAN to share a single internet connection; and protect LAN-connected devices using network security tools.
 - A local area network (LAN) is a communications system that allows the interconnection and sharing of resources between independent devices within a moderately sized geographic area
- (b) "Wired LAN is also known as Ethernet LAN connection. In this type of connection, wires are used to connect the computers. It is a fast connection and latency is low in a wired connection. Latency means when you transfer data then in how much time it is received

to the destination. So data reach time is low in wired LAN. In industries, Ethernet LAN is used because in this case data is not lost and each user gets a dedicated line for transferring the data. Ethernet speed is about 1gbps. Different types of equipment are used in wired LAN e.g. modern, switch, hub, router, coaxial cable is used to make wired LAN connection.

(c) Wireless LAN is also known as a Wi-Fi connection. It has low speed as compared to wired LAN. The speed of Wi-Fi follows IEEE 802.11 standards. The latency rate is high in wireless LAN that means transfer time from one location to other is high. There is a high chance that data can collapse with the other data i.e. the signals may collide with each other if many devices are sending and receiving data wirelessly.

SECTION 5. Establishment of LAN – The Bangsamoro Government shall design and establish its Local Area Network (LAN) system that shall connect and serve all its offices including the Office of the Chief Minister, the Ministries, the Parliament, and all other agencies attached to them.

SECTION 6. Design – The Ministry of Science and Technology (MOST) and the Bangsamoro Information and Communication Technology (BICTO) shall provide the most appropriate LAN type or structure for the Bangsamoro Government within thirty (30) days upon approval of this act.

SECTION 7. Implementing Rules and Regulation. – The Ministry of Science and Technology, and Bangsamoro Information and Communication Technology shall provide the Implementing Rules and Regulation of this Act within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act.

SECTION 8. Separability Clause. – If any part of this Act is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 9. Repealing Clause. - Any law, issuances, orders, letter of instruction, administrative order, rules or regulations contrary to or is inconsistent with the provision of this Act is hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.

SECTION 10. Effectivity Clause. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation in the Region.
